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COSTS

- No costs for uniforms, unless they are lost or damaged
- Almost all of our activities are free
- Maintenance items not included (polish, shoe shining cloth, etc)
- Name tag needs to be purchased (\$3 at canteen)
- Optional clothing available for purchase
- Canteen (open during parade nights)



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REQUIRED ITEMS

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ADVANCED REGISTRATION FOR ACTIVITIES

 - The deposit is not refunded after the registration date or if the cadet does not show up to the activity



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EATING BEFORE CADETS

MEDICAL DISCLOSURE

MEDICATION

- If you have concerns that your cadet will need assistance, please speak with the Admin O or CO



HEALTH & SAFETY

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INJURIES

Depending on injury cadet will be assessed and

- Minor Injury provided with basic first aid
- Mild Injury contact parents
- Severe / Life Threatening Ambulance is called

Nurse on staff in addition to first-aid qualified officer or senior cadet available.

Free Standard First-Aid courses coordinated annually at the unit.

HEALTH CARDS

Please pay attention to Routine Orders / permission forms / kit lists. If a health card is required, a health card must be brought (original cards only)

CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

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CODE OF CONDUCT

- All cadets and officers sign a Code of Conduct.
- Failure to adhere to the Code of Conduct results in disciplinary measures.
- Depending on the severity of the issue:

Cautionary Notice	Consequences follow (extra duties, demotion, suspension of promotion, etc)	
Written Warning		
Suspension		
Termination of Membership	Cannot join cadets again, may affect military enrolment	

CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

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HARASSMENT TRAINING & BULLYING

- Zero tolerance for harassment and bullying
- Annually, the cadets receive a harassment training course
- Unit morale and esprit-de-corps is pushed and encouraged throughout
- If your cadet is being bullied or harassed: speak up! Let us know. We want to fix the problem and make sure everyone feels safe and welcomed



CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

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POLICE INVESTIGATION PROCESS


- 1. Commanding Officer is notified
- Basic fact-finding is conducted to confirm if circumstances warrant a police investigation
- 3. Cadet chain-of-command is notified
- 4. Military Police (MPs) or OPP is contacted
- Depending on the police investigation, the cadet may be suspended or removed from the program






If the alleged crime takes place at the Armoury, or a military establishment, Military Police have jurisdiction and investigate (even though cadets are civilians).


